1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL

3. EDUCATION PRESENTATION

Martin Perales, Environmental Scientist II, will present on Napa RCD's fish monitoring program and the proposed Napa River Watershed Fish Passage Restoration Program.

4. CONSENT CALENDAR

All items on the consent calendar are considered ministerial or non-substantive and subject to a single motion approval. With the concurrence of the Chair, a Director may request discussion of an item on the consent calendar.

A. Authorize Executive Director to execute agreements related to the 2023 Water Efficiency Technical Assistance Program grant award.

Napa RCD entered into an Agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture ("CDFA") for the 2023 Water Efficiency Technical Assistance Program for the purpose of providing technical advice and planning services for owners of farms and vineyards in Napa, Solano, Sonoma, and Lake Counties to facilitate beneficial irrigation water, nutrient, and soil management, irrigation system performance evaluations, and pump efficiency testing. Sonoma RCD, Solano RCD, Lake RCD, and the Lake County Winegrowing Commission were identified as subrecipients of CDFA Agreement funds for the purpose of providing technical advice and planning services for owners of farmlands in their respective counties.

B. Authorize Resolution 2024-01 approving applications for grant funds from the Wildlife Conservation Board ("WCB") for two projects to the Napa River Watershed Fish Passage Restoration Program.

Napa RCD intends to submit two grant applications to the WCB for the "Napa River Watershed Fish Passage Restoration Program," one for a Planning project and the other for an Implementation project, to accelerate remediation of artificial fish migration barriers across the Napa River watershed. WCB requires that the Board of Directors authorize a resolution to be submitted with the grant application.

C. Authorize Executive Director to execute an amendment to California Trout Agreement No. 21-107NR and an amendment to Napa RCD Agreement No. 2020-46 with WRA, Inc.

Napa RCD and California Trout entered into Agreement No. 21-107NR on July 16, 2020 to partner in implementing the project entitled "Sulphur Creek Fish Passage Improvement Project." This agreement has been amended three times to account for changes to project timeline and budget. Napa RCD entered into Agreement No. 2020-46 with WRA, Inc. on July 9, 2020 to receive specialized services for the project, and has amended this

agreement twice to account for changes to the project timeline and budget. Napa RCD desires to amend these two agreements to account for additional changes to the project timeline. Although 100% design plans and permitting documents have been completed, the extension, which has been provided by grant funders, allows time for additional coordination with the project team and landowners while awaiting implementation funding for the project.

D. Authorize Executive Director to execute an amendment to California Association of Resource Conservation District Agreement No. 2021028 for the Emergency Forest Restoration Program.

Napa RCD and the California Association of Resource Conservation Districts entered into Agreement No. 2021028 on May 17, 2023 to provide technical assistance to landowners impacted by the Glass and LNU fires through the Farm Services Agency's Emergency Forest Restoration Program (EFRP). Napa RCD wishes to amend this agreement to account for additional funding being allocated to Napa RCD for the technical assistance we are providing.
